



Does your T&L research grant proposal require technology?

- **Data storage and management:** will it comply with UQ standards; is an ethics application required?
- **User interfaces:** how will students access the technology; how will you access it?
- **A budget:** what is required for development, testing, deployment, and operation (as applicable)?
